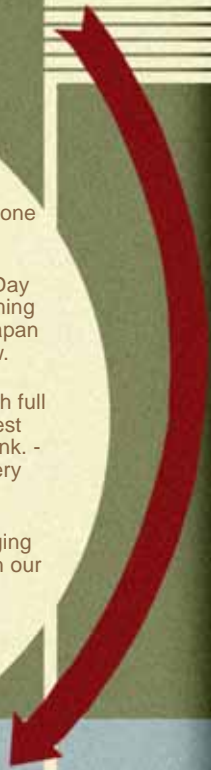

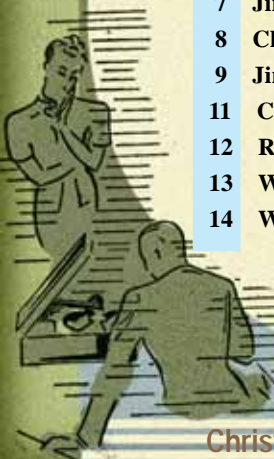

1 **There's Frost On The Moon** Gösta Törner

This rendition of that classical swing-tune, prominently known in the Glenn Miller and Artie Shaw-Versions, was recorded in 1937 in Stockholm by Gösta Törners congregation of local musicians with Sven Arefeld on vocals! The record was issued on Sonora and shows the high quality standard of Swedish Jazz-musicians since the early 1930's.

That standard was held to present days, started with bands like Törners and goes through illustre names like that of Nils Henning-Orsted Peterson and Jenny Löbel today (see her Link on our HP!)

2 **Let It Snow**

The Ramblers

Yes, its the band around Theo Uden-Massmann, that was built in the late 20's and was very successful to the late 50's. The Orchestra was mainly located in Holland and Belgium and most of the recordings were made in Hilversum and Brussels. The vocal-ensemble were De Blouwbaardjes, taylored after US-origins. This recording was made in 1947 for Decca in Brussels.

3 **It's Gotta Be This Or That** Pied Pipers

They started recording as vocal-ensemble for Dorsey and later (since the 40's) went on their own for Capitol Records in L.A. Jo Stafford did a lot as the female Part until her marriage to Paul Weston. This title fits well into the Christmas context, as there's always a wish and the problem with the decision!

4 **It Happened In Sun Valley** Glenn Miller

That winter-classic from 1941 needs no comments, if you know the film!

5 **Jingle bells** Fats Waller

Fatsy Watsy Waller at his best, recorded in the 30's for Victor it is one of the strangest and liveliest interpretations of that tune!

6 **Christmas Night In Harlem** Paul Whiteman

Although an oldtimer in the music-business still in the 30's, Whiteman always tried to be en vogue! - He engaged Jazz-aces like Jack Teagarden, Beiderbecke et al to stay "Modernistic" - This track dates from a live-show and announces itself!

7 **Jingle Bells** Leo Watson

Stranger than fiction, no comments needed for that groovy Yip-Roc-Hereesy-Thing from the mid 40's

9 Jingle Bells Glenn Miller
Dates from Christmas-Eve 24.12.41 and was broadcasted for
Chesterfield Cigarettes! Note that cool announcement!

11 C-mon a My House Kay Starr & Dave Cavanaugh
Kay gave us not only candy, but everything, she owns. - Could
be more christmas elsewhere? Cut for Capitol around 1950

12 Rockin' Chair The Hi Lo's
Yes, sit back and relax in your old Rockin' Chair and look at that
damn old Christmas tree! - Columbia was the label., they
recorded for in the mid 50's, the blueprint for every expert
close-harmony-ensemble!

13 White christmas The Ravens
Weeeeeeeel, deep, deeper, Ricks! - Bass-vocalist Jimmy Ricks
does his best on Mercurys Ravens-issue, nothing more to say
about it!

14 White Christmas Keytones
Everyone, who was in Rock and Roll during the 80's
and 90's should remember the Keytones.
Now they are back!
